

## I Spy Hexies

You are going to love playing with the Hexies!

We are going to cut out our 2.5” Hexagons, which finish 2” (mine are all the same color centers). You can certainly “fussie” cut your centers if you choose. Then we are going to go around the hexies with 4 rounds of 1.5” strips. We will alternate the neutral colors and the scrappy colors. You will be amazed at how fast these build.

### All the necessities:

Sewing machine, foot pedal & all power cords

Basic sewing supplies

Rotary cutter & mat

Iron and pressing surface

Rulers: You will need a Hexagon Ruler. I use the Darlene Zimmerman ruler which has from a 1” finished Hexie up to a 5” finished one. The Equilateral Triangle Ruler, I use is a Creative Grid 60 degree Triangle. You will need a ruler with a 60 degree line and I like the Creative Grid 4.5” X 12.5” ruler which has the 60 degree line. This is a lot of rulers but you will use them all.

### Fabrics:

Center Hexies ---- cut your strips 2.5” X Width of Fabric

Making a small size, such as a table runner, cut 1 strip of fabric, larger quilt will need 2 strips.

Background fabrics: cut 1.5” strips, different lengths are fine,  
Depending on the size, cut a few to begin and you can always cut more.

Contrasting fabrics: cut 1.5” strips, the more “Variety” the better, you will need short and longer strips. The inside takes shorter strips and round 4 will take longer strips. If you don’t have a stash then different fat quarters work well.

Connecting Equilateral Triangles: cut 2 strips of your connecting color—mine is yellow – 5.5” X WOF. You may not get to this in class but you will have them cut ready to go.
